# Minutes of the Board of Studies Meeting

Date: 01 February 2025 | Venue: Department of Criminology and Forensic Science, CG10.

The meeting commenced with a prayer, followed by a welcome address by **Dr. G. Shunmuga Sundaram**, Head of the Department. He emphasized the significance of continuous curriculum development, the inclusion of the Indian Knowledge System (IKS), and the requirement for 40% skill-based Learining.

Review of Previous Minutes - The minutes of the previous meeting were reviewed and approved without modifications by the members.

Finalizing syllabus and Recommendations - The board identified repetitions in course units and suggested restructuring for better clarity. Mr. Sivasanthosh recommended dividing Semester II - Police Administration (23UCFC22), Unit III: Recruitment of Police, due to its extensive content, which was approved (details in Table 1 attached).

Dr. Anantha Ambeth Selvi proposed modifications for Semester III - Information Security (23UCFE32) and Semester IV - Child Psychology (23UCFE41), which were accepted. Dr. G. Shunmuga Sundaram sought clarifications on the inclusion of recently introduced criminal laws (BNS, BNSS, and BSA) 2023 and effect on 1<sup>st</sup> July and board suggested the integration of new criminal laws (BNS, BNSS, and BSA in the remodified units into Semester IV - Criminal Laws in the Criminal Justice System (23UCFC41) and restructuring Semester VI - Community Policing, removing three repetitive units and adding new ones (details in Table 1 attached).

Integration of Indian Knowledge System (IKS) and Skill-Based Learning: Dr. Enanalap Periyar External provided insights on incorporating IKS (details in Table 2 attached) and Dr. Xaviers Louis subject Expert proposed a framework for integrating skill-based content through practical applications and industry collaborations (details in Table 3 attached).

Proposal for Industry Collaboration: The board also recommended including an industry expert for practical insights.

The meeting concluded with a vote of thanks by Dr. Anantha Ambeth Selvi. The agreed curriculum revisions will be implemented in the upcoming academic session.
