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The National Cadet Corps (NCC) of St. Xavier's College trains students in discipline, leadership, and national service, instilling a spirit of patriotism and civic responsibility. It provides opportunities for adventure, military training, and community engagement.

The NCC unit of St. Xavier's College carried out a series of well-organized activities from 08.08.2025 to 28.02.2026, promoting discipline, leadership, and social responsibility among cadets. The programme began with the Sports Day Drill on 08.08.2025, followed by the Anti-Drug Awareness Human Chain on 13.08.2025, Health Run on 14.08.2025, and Independence Day Parade and College Celebration on 15.08.2025. A Blood Donation Camp was held on 26.08.2025. Cadets rendered Guard of Honour on 02.09.2025 and performed discipline duty during Teacher's Day on 08.09.2025. The First Parade and Orientation were conducted on 23.09.2025 and 24.09.2025. Major training exposures included the Leadership and Team Building Camp from 30.10.2025 to 08.11.2025 and the Mountaineering Camp from 05.01.2026 to 19.01.2026. Career guidance programmes were organized on 23.01.2026 and 26.01.2026, along with Republic Day celebrations.



Further activities included Common Parades on 05.02.2026 and 06.02.2026, Felicitation Ceremony on 12.02.2026, 'B' Certificate Examination on 21.02.2026 and 22.02.2026, and Graduation Day on 28.02.2026. Cadets also participated in national-level camps and competitions, strengthening leadership, teamwork, and resilience. The NCC activities carried out during the academic year resulted in significant learning outcomes for the cadets, enhancing their leadership, discipline, teamwork, and confidence through various camps and training programmes.

The National Service Scheme (NSS) promotes community service, social awareness, and student involvement in developmental activities. It encourages students to actively participate in social welfare and nation-building initiatives.

The NSS units of St. Xavier's College organized a wide spectrum of extension activities from 26.06.2025 to 11.03.2026, promoting social responsibility and community engagement. The initiatives began with the International Day Against Drug Abuse Awareness Campaign on 26.06.2025, followed by International Yoga Day on 27.06.2025 and a Campus Cleaning Drive on 21.07.2025. Independence Day was observed on 15.08.2025, while the NSS Inaugural Programme "Five Fiesta" was held on 23.09.2025, followed by the Block Level Sports Meet on 26.09.2025 and the Palm Seed and Tree Plantation Programme on 22.10.2025.



Volunteers actively participated in the Viksit Bharat Youth Festival on 09.12.2025, Human Rights Day on 10.12.2025, and the Blood Donation Camp on 11.12.2025, collecting 127 units of blood. The NSS Special Camps for girls and boys from 19.01.2026 to 25.01.2026 & 22.02.2026 to 28.02.2026 focused on rural development, health awareness, and skill training. Participation in national initiatives on 11.03.2026 enhanced civic engagement.



NSS volunteers also brought recognition to the institution through their participation and accomplishments. Ms. Packialakshmi (II B.Sc. Computer Science) won the First Prize in the Painting Competition at the Viksit Bharat Youth Festival 2025 – District Level Cultural Competition and was selected to represent the district at the State Level Competition in Chennai. In addition, three students — Mr. Isaac Roshan Edwin Fernando (II BBA), Mr. Rakesh Chidambaram R (I BCA), and Ms. Siva Eswaran (II B.Com) — successfully participated in the Future Youth Leaders Boot Camp, gaining training in leadership and civic engagement.

These activities strengthened leadership, teamwork, and service values, reflecting the spirit of NSS and contributed to SDGs 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 11, 16, and 17, ensuring holistic development, community engagement, and responsible citizenship.



The clubs promote voluntary blood donation, first aid awareness, and health services among students and the community. They cultivate a sense of empathy, humanitarian service, and civic responsibility.



The Youth Red Cross, Red Ribbon Club, and Blood Donors Club of St. Xavier's College carried out impactful health and awareness initiatives from 26.06.2025 to 06.03.2026, promoting social responsibility and well-being. The activities began with the Anti-Drug Awareness Campaign on 26.06.2025, followed by International Yoga Day on 27.06.2025. Health-oriented programmes such as the Deworming Programme on 02.09.2025 and Dental Camp on 10.09.2025 emphasized preventive care.



A major highlight was the Blood Donation Camp on 11.12.2025, where 127 students donated blood, reflecting strong humanitarian commitment. The institution also received the State-Level Blood Donor Award on 10.10.2025, recognizing its outstanding contribution to voluntary blood donation. Further awareness was created through the Anti-Drugs and Suicidal Prevention Programme on 06.03.2026, focusing on mental health and social responsibility.

These initiatives enhanced student awareness on health, hygiene, and social issues while strengthening empathy, volunteerism, and community engagement.



St. Xavier's College (Autonomous), Palayamkottai, has been honoured with the State-Level Blood Donor Award for the year 2024. The award was presented by the Honourable Minister for Health and Family Welfare, Government of Tamil Nadu, Mr. Ma. Subramanian, at a function held in Chennai on 10th October 2025. On behalf of the college, Dr. S. Prince Jebaraj, Programme Officer of YRC, RRC and Blood Donation Unit, received the award. The recognition was bestowed on the college for successfully organizing numerous blood donation camps and encouraging a large number of student volunteers to donate blood to meet the needs of patients at the Tirunelveli Government Medical College Hospital. A total of 17 higher education institutions across Tamil Nadu received this prestigious award.

Johnson Gritto, who participated in national workshops and shared successful rural models at the UBA Story Lab, Hyderabad (03–04.07.2025), Mushroom Project, Kulasekaram (25.08.2025), CSR Meet, Delhi (11.09.2025), UBA-SEG Workshop, Gandhigram (18.09.2025), and Proposal Development Workshop, Gandhigram (22.12.2025). His exemplary contributions earned the Best UBA Coordinator Award, while the college received the Best Institution Award for excellence in community engagement.

Key rural livelihood initiatives included:

- Bakery Technology Project (Inaugurated 27.10.2025): Hands-on training in bakery skills for rural women and youth in Tharuvai Village, Palayamkottai.
- Six-day Bakery Training Programme (09–15.12.2025): Empowered 22 women with practical baking and entrepreneurial skills, including cakes, brownies, biscuits, and tea cakes.

Centre nurtures entrepreneurial skills and rural development initiatives among students. It equips students with practical knowledge to promote business and social innovation in rural areas.

The Centre for Rural Entrepreneurship Development of St. Xavier's College, Palayamkottai, promoted rural entrepreneurship through a series of initiatives from 23.02.2026 to 26.02.2026. On 23.02.2026, an Orientation Programme on Rural Entrepreneurship Avenues and Challenges motivated students to explore business opportunities and understand practical challenges in rural contexts.



A Hands-on Experience Programme on Cake Making on 25.02.2026 provided students practical skills in bakery and food production, encouraging entrepreneurial interest in the food industry. On 26.02.2026, students gained real-time exposure to small business management through the Xaverian Student Co-operative Store (XCOS), strengthening their understanding of cooperative entrepreneurship. These activities enhanced entrepreneurial knowledge, practical skills, innovative thinking, and problem-solving abilities, empowering students for sustainable livelihood initiatives.



The initiatives contributed to SDGs 2, 4, 5, 8, 12, and 17 through skill development, gender-inclusive participation, sustainable practices, and collaborations with student entrepreneurs and local resources.

The MAGIS Club of St. Xavier's College inspires students to strive for excellence by nurturing moral, spiritual, and ethical values, while fostering leadership and a commitment to social responsibility..

The Magis Club of St. Xavier's College, Palayamkottai, organized motivational and value-based sessions for non-Catholic students during the academic year 2025–2026.



On 09.09.2025, students attended a Motivational Talk on Leadership by Dr. C. M. Tom Manohar, CEO, MaBa Educational Services, Chennai. Another session on "O World Around! WOMEN'S studies CENTRE

The Centre for Women Studies promotes women's empowerment, gender equality, health awareness, and skill development, fostering moral growth, confidence, and self-reliance.



The Centre for Women's Studies of St. Xavier's College promotes women's empowerment, health awareness, and skill development. On 15.07.2025, the Centre inaugurated certificate courses in Dress Designing and Tailoring. Special lectures on health and hygiene for I UG boys and girls were conducted on 25.07.2025. A Self-Employment Training Programme on Bangle Making was held on 10.08.2025. A National-Level Seminar on "Women as Change-Makers: Achieving Excellence through Empowerment" took place on 20.02.2026.



Competitions for students and staff were conducted from 26.02.2026 to 05.03.2026, and the International Women's Day celebration was held on 07.03.2026. A Free Health Check-up Programme was conducted in association with Annai Velankanni Multispeciality Hospital on 23.03.2026 and 24.03.2026. These initiatives enhanced practical skills, entrepreneurial abilities, confidence, and awareness about health, leadership, and gender equality, contributing to personal growth and social development.



These programmes promoted women's empowerment, health awareness, skill development, and self-reliance, contributing to SDGs 3, 4, 5, 8, and 17.



The STAND programme develops leadership, critical thinking, and civic engagement skills among undergraduate and postgraduate students. It encourages active participation in social, ethical, and educational initiatives.

During the academic year 2025–2026, STAND actively engaged in rural development across 35 villages through 38 departments. Key initiatives included a Micro Greens Training Programme on 09.09.2025 in collaboration with Blossom Agri Tech, benefiting 56 villagers and 67 students by promoting sustainable agriculture and self-employment. On 09.12.2025, a District-Level Workshop on Women Empowerment and Entrepreneurial Training was conducted with the Department of Zoology for 85 students and 42 women from STAND villages.



A one-week Bakery Products Training ran from 09.12.2025 to 15.12.2025 in collaboration with UBA, followed by a sale at INDECO on 20.12.2025. Additionally, a Plastic-Free Awareness Programme was held on 15.12.2025 for 352 student representatives with the Enviro Club and Province Ecology Commission, and an Even Semester Planning Meeting took place on 01.12.2025. Under the GPDP Hand-Holding Programme, focused development support was provided to the villages of Chinthamani, Azhagappapuram, Urumankulam, and Kovankulam, emphasizing low-cost initiatives, women empowerment, health, and entrepreneurship.



These activities enhanced students' leadership, teamwork, and problem-solving skills, while promoting rural development, sustainable agriculture, health awareness, and environmental responsibility, contributing to SDGs 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 8, 11, 12, 13, and 17.



The Theatre Club cultivates performing arts skills, creativity, and team collaboration. It organizes stage performances, dramas, and workshops to enhance artistic expression.

The SXC Theatre Club nurtures creativity, theatrical skills, and artistic expression among students. During 2025–2026, the club conducted theatre workshops, educational visits, and participated in inter-collegiate competitions. Members attended a one-day workshop on 14.08.2025 with Arul Anandar College and Manal Magudi Nadaga Nilam, gaining practical exposure to acting and stage performance.



On 28.08.2025, 20 students visited The American College, Madurai, to witness the play "An Experiment with Truth," learning about dialogue delivery, stage setting, and technical aspects of theatre. A One-Day Theatrical Workshop on 12.02.2026 trained 58 students in acting, script writing, and short play enactment. The club also achieved notable success in inter-collegiate competitions, winning first and second prizes for plays including "The Tempest", 05.05.2025, "Nagamandala", 11.09.2025, and "The Cheese Incident" 17.09.2025. Activities enhanced students' creativity, confidence, teamwork, and appreciation for literature, culture, and social themes.

The Campus Ministry fosters spiritual growth, ethical reflection, and community service among students. It organizes prayer services, retreats, and social outreach activities.
